Jake does the job for Maleny Cricket

An inspired spell of bowling by Jake Heading has led the Maleny Redbacks to a stunning outright victory over Landsborough Loggers on Saturday.

Landsborough started the day at 6 for 65 chasing the Redbacks' first innings total of 216.

Experienced campaigner, Todd English soon had the Loggers in a spin claiming a wicket in the second over. Nick Selman then added to the four wickets he claimed last week to end with the outstanding figures of 6 for 24 off 9 overs.

Landsborough were all out for a first innings total of 116.

The Redbacks went in to their second innings chasing quick runs. Selman was again there to deliver, smashing a quick fire 76 (no), including 5 massive sixes.

A forceful 27 by Sam Wilson helped the Redbacks to declare with a led of 255 and under two hours to claim ten wickets.

Opener Jake Heading, bowled with accuracy and aggression to tear through the Loggers top order. Claiming the first six wickets, Heading put the Redbacks in the box seat and grabbed the figures of

Maleny was exceptional in the field with Ryan Cosgrove claiming four catches and James Sommer producing an opportunistic run out.

When English, Selman and Greg Corkin mopped up the tail, the Loggers were all out for 79, handing the Redbacks a 176 run outright victory.

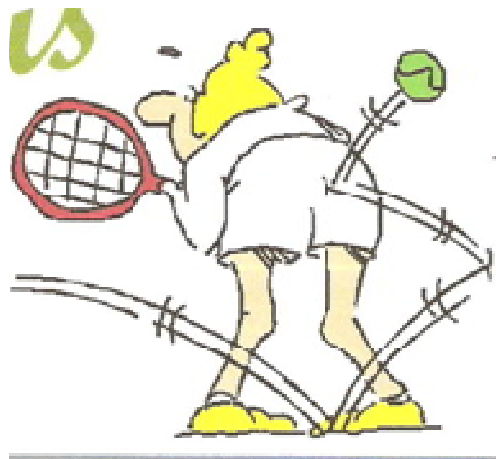

Maleny RSL Remembers.....

The R.S.L. Maleny Sub Branch will hold a Remembrance Day Ceremony beginning at 10.50am on Thursday November 11th at the Maleny RSL Hall Cenotaph. Remembrance Day marks the anniversary of the armistice which ended the First World War (1914-18). It was at 11 am on 11 November 1918 that the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years continuous warfare.

The RSL Maleny is urging everyone to honour the memory of the fallen on Remembrance Day by observing a minute's silence and wearing a red poppy during the month of November.

The wearing of the red poppy to keep faith began when an American, Miss Moira Michael, read the poem "In Flanders Field" and was so greatly impressed that she decided always to wear a poppy to keep the faith.

"We're asking all Queenslanders to pause and remember those who served in all wars and conflicts and to support the RSL's annual Poppy Appeal by wearing a red poppy," said Chris Brooker, RSL Maleny President.

Chris continued that; "RSL Maleny Sub Branch will be selling poppies in the lead-up to Remembrance Day. Buying a poppy is a simple but practical way to remember and pay tribute to soldiers who have fought and died for Australia's freedom and peace."

Sales from poppies provide vital funds for Sub Branch activities benefiting veterans, and Chris urged people to be on the look-out for poppy sellers.
