### Next important step in Maleny Precinct plan completed

The next step in Cr Jenny McKay's planning for the Maleny Precinct has just been completed.

Representatives of Maleny District Sport & Recreation Club inc presented submissions to the Precinct working group.

The submission shows that it is feasible to include four football playing fields, athletics field, two bowling greens and an aquatic centre along with a community golf course centered around a combined club-house.

Cr McKay is to report back to the Sunshine Coast Regional Council by March with the final overall precinct plan being decided upon by mid-year. This overall plan would allow individual leases to be discussed later this year.
