Maleny Redback Thirds crush The Gingers

The Hotel Maleny Redbacks' 3rd Division cricket team cruised to victory over the Yandina Gingers in their one day match on Saturday.

Winning the toss and batting first Yandina got off to a quick start scoring freely and punishing some wayward bowling. Despite Maleny bowler Jake Heading

claiming two wickets, Yandina were in the dominating position of being 2 for 115 after 16 overs.

Maleny then turned the game around, drying up the runs and taking wickets regularly. Youngster Nick Selman showed his class with a fantastic spell of bowling claiming 1 for 17 off 5 overs.

Then the Redbacks' two experienced campaigners, Luke Thamm and Greg Corkin tore through the remainder of the Gingers batting, with Thamm claiming 3 for 18 off 7 and Corkin 3 for 7 off 4. When the last wicket fell Yandina was all out for 144, losing 8 wickets for only 29 runs in a 13 over period.

The Redbacks were hardly troubled in their chase for the total.

Opener Tim Cork scored a rapid 28, before Alistair Baker and Michael Oliver combined in 69 run partnership. Baker fell just short of his half century being stumped for 44.

Oliver then continued on, to remain 41 not out and hit the winning runs as the Redbacks coasted to victory achieving the required total in the 21st over.

Maleny's next game is a two day

game against Tewantin-Noosa at Tewantin.
